Interface provided HVAC, plumbing and fire/life safety design services to transform the East Kong Yick Building into the new home for the Wing Luke Asian Museum. Built in 1910 to house Chinese, Japanese and Filipino immigrants working in the local industries, the structure is slated to become a dynamic cultural center in the Seattle Chinatown district. Leased retail space will occupy 2,000 sf on the first floor, with the upper floors devoted to visitor services, galleries, administration, classrooms, meeting rooms and a small theater.

Preservation and adaptive re-use guided the interiors for this multicultural Asian museum and community center.
